9 (a) Definitions.—In this Act:

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

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1	(1) Administrator.—The term "Adminis-
2	trator" means the Administrator of the Health Re-
3	sources and Services Administration.
4	(2) ELIGIBLE ENTITY.—The term "eligible enti-
5	ty" means a State or institution of higher education.
6	(3) Institution of Higher Education.—The
7	term "institution of higher education" has the
8	meaning given the term in section 101(a) of the
9	Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1001(a)).
10	(4) State.—The term "State" means each of
11	the 50 States, the District of Columbia, the Com-
12	monwealth of Puerto Rico, and each of the outlying
13	areas (as such term is defined in section 8101 of the
14	Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965
15	(20 U.S.C. 7801)).
16	(b) Authorization of Grants.—
17	(1) In general.—The Administrator shall
18	award grants, on a competitive basis, to eligible enti-
19	ties to enable the eligible entities to expand or create
20	health care provider pipeline programs.
21	(2) Duration.—Grants awarded under this
22	section shall be for a term of not more than 5 years.
23	(3) Reservation.—The Administrator shall
24	reserve 25 percent of amounts made available to
25	carry out this section to award grants to eligible en-

1	tities that are eligible institutions described in sec-
2	tion 371 of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20
3	U.S.C. 1067q).
4	(4) Priority.—In awarding grants under this
5	section, the Administrator shall give priority to—
6	(A) programs designed to serve under-
7	served or rural communities;
8	(B) programs designed to increase the
9	number of health care professionals who are
10	primary care providers; or
11	(C) eligible entities that intend to recruit a
12	majority of individuals to participate in the
13	health care provider pipeline program from
14	within the same State as the eligible entity or
15	in which the eligible entity is located.
16	(c) Application.—An eligible entity that desires to
17	receive a grant under this section shall submit an applica-
18	tion to the Administrator at such time, in such manner
19	and accompanied by such information as the Adminis-
20	trator may require.
21	(d) Use of Funds.—
22	(1) In general.—An eligible entity that re-
23	ceives a grant under this section shall use the grant
24	funds to expand or create health care provider pipe-
25	line programs that are designed to increase the num-

1	ber of one or more of the following groups of health
2	care professionals:
3	(A) Medical Doctors and Doctors of Osteo-
4	pathic Medicine.
5	(B) Physician Assistants.
6	(C) Nurse Practitioners.
7	(D) Nurses.
8	(E) Emergency Medical Technicians.
9	(F) Dentists.
10	(G) Behavioral Health Providers.
11	(2) Additional providers.—The Adminis-
12	trator may add to the list of health care profes-
13	sionals eligible for health care provider pipeline pro-
14	grams under paragraph (1) based on areas of need
15	and shortages across the Nation.
16	(e) Reports.—An eligible entity that receives a
17	grant under this section shall submit a report to the Ad-
18	ministrator, not later than 5 years after receiving the
19	grant and at the end of the grant period, on the implemen-
20	tation of the health care provider pipeline program, includ-
21	ing details on—
22	(1) a breakdown of funding uses;
23	(2) admission rates to the program;
24	(3) admission criteria for the program;
25	(4) demographics of admitted students; and

- 1 (5) program drop-out rates.
- 2 (f) Grants After Reauthorization.—If the
- 3 grant program under this section is authorized for a fiscal
- 4 year after fiscal year 2029, the Administrator, in awarding
- 5 grants after fiscal year 2029, shall give priority to eligible
- 6 entities that have already received a grant under this sec-
- 7 tion.
- 8 (g) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is
- 9 authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section
- 10 \$215,000,000 for the period of fiscal years 2025 through
- 11 2029.
